A viagem comandada por Vasco da Gama até Calecute, foi ponto de partida da implantação portuguesa na costa oriental africana e na Índia. O primeiro contacto deu-se a 20 de Maio de 1498. Após alguns conflitos com mercadores árabes que detinham o monopólio das rotas de especiarias, Vasco da Gama conseguiu uma carta de concessão ambigua para as trocas comerciais com o samorim de Calecute, aí deixando alguns portugueses para estabelecerem uma feitoria. Pouco depois, foi criada em Lisboa a Casa da Índia para administrar o monopólio régio da navegação e comércio com o Oriente.

O objetivo de Portugal no Oceano Índico foi o de assegurar o monopólio do comércio de especiarias. Jogando continuamente da rivalidade que opunha hindus e muçulmanos, os portugueses estabeleceram, entre 1500 e 1510, várias fortalezas e feitorias comerciais.

Monarcha is a serified type family, with a strong influence of the baroque style, for extended texts. Its roman versions are slightly skewed, in the sense of reading, and its italics has unusual calligraphic features. Moreover, the contrast between thick and thin strokes is relatively smaller than in conventional serif fonts. These characteristics, coupled with its rounded shapes, give Monarcha a delicious fluidity and texture.


Monarcha innovates and brings an exclusive OpenType feature to convert Arabic to Roman numerals up to 3999. It also has several other professional features - small caps, fractions, old style-, lining-, tabular numbers, scientific superior/inferior figures, stylistic sets and more than 40 different ligatures (standard + discretionary).

The family consists of 8 styles, 4 weights - Book, Regular, SemiBold and Bold - plus their respective italic versions. The fonts are available in OpenType PS format and have extended character set to support CE, Baltic, Turkish as well as Western European languages.

Small Capitals

Case Sensitive

Standard Ligatures

This feature replaces a sequence of characters with a more 'harmonious' glyph. It is on by default.

Replaces a group of glyphs with a single glyph which, in contrast to the Standard Ligatures, is more decorative.

Swashes

Numerators

Replaces selected figures with numerator figures.

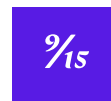

Replaces lining or oldstyle figures and lowercase letters with smaller variants, which sit lower than the baseline, primarily for scientific notation.
